Dear Friends,

EALgreen's mission is to lower the financial barriers to a college education. Student debt exceeded \$1.5 trillion in 2018 with the average student owing more than \$28,000 at graduation. More than 10 percent of these borrowers will default never able to overcome the burden with which they began their professional lives. EAL helps to minimize this burden. With donated inventory, materials and supplies, our organization generates both funding for student financial aid and savings for colleges across the U.S. During 2018, we proudly launched a Californiabased operation to partner with corporate and educational partners on the West Coast.

The idea behind EAL is unique and without precedent. Developed as a supply-chain enterprise, EAL provides a solution for surplus inventory providing donors an efficient channel to meet Corporate Responsibility and Sustainability goals without increasing charitable giving budgets. Powering its own circular economy, EAL redirects "like new" surplus materials to a growing and diverse network of 50 environmentally-minded campuses. Colleges and universities are like small cities. Our partners use EAL's inventory of products and supplies to lower their operating costs. Savings are paid forward to students in the form of tuition discounts. Once a year, EAL makes additional contributions in the form of cash awards to participating institutions providing even

more resources to help students graduate with less debt..

When EAL began 37 years ago, neither the business world nor higher education could have predicted the extraordinary levels to which surplus inventory or student debt would grow. But for the 17,447 students who graduated with little or no debt and for donor partners who have embraced a new kind of corporate philanthropy, EAL exemplifies a solution that works. 






How the Model Works: Inventory and Monetary Awards
